Dear Members and Friends of St. Luke:

One of the nice things about being a Pastor is going to the hospital or home after the birth of a child - to rejoice with the parents, and to arrange for a Baptism. The day is complete when they ask you: "Pastor, would you like to hold the baby?"

We all want to hold the baby - not only adults, but little children as well. This ties in with our celebration of Christmas. Like Simeon in one of the Gospel readings, we want to hold the Christ child in our arms. We want to make Him welcome in our world. We want to do something for our Lord that this Good News is shared with more and more people.

Christmas begins with our desire to hold Him in our arms. Yet as nice and as sweet as this is Christmas is not just what we can do for Him, but first, and foremost, what He can do for us!

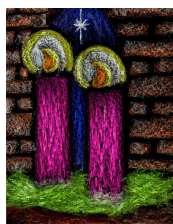

Harvest House

The purpose of Harvest House is to help people become physically and spiritually whole.

Harvest House began in 1993 when cofounders Gary and Linda Tatu sold their home in the suburbs to buy and refurbish a derelict city church. Harvest House provides space for non-profit and community organizations. Up to 2,000 people use the building each month for activities such as support meetings, block clubs, bible study, scouting and spiritual retreats.

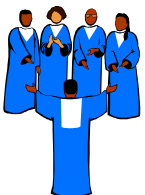
Through the Baby and Children's Outreach Program, Harvest House is the largest supplier of FREE baby items, baby and children's clothing in the tri-county area. One hundred and fifty plus agencies refer clients to this program. In 2008, 5,846 children received items from Harvest House.

Harvest House accepts new and gently used donations of clothing (newborn to size 14), socks, underwear, toys, books, blankets, cribs, strollers, car seats etc. We accept any item for a baby or child except diapers, food, or formula. Your donation is appreciated and is tax deductible.

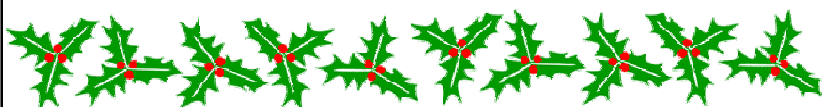
