Dear Members and Friends of

St. Luke:

On New Year's Eve we are reminded of the passing of time. We celebrate the ending of the old year and the arrival of the new. Despite the resolutions we make, we will still be the same people next year as we are today. Habits are very difficult to change. It takes much more than wishful thinking.

Time is a gift that God has given to each of us. On this earth that time is limited. What this means is that we must use the gift wisely. Time is an interesting phenomena. Every hour has exactly 60 minutes, no more, no less. Yet some hours go by quickly – and others seem to never end. Why is it when we are enjoying ourselves, the time flies by, but when we go through trials and frustration, time drags its feet?

NEW ORGAN

Our new organ has been installed. The instrument is an Allen Organ Master Design Series 8. The organ was created through research from NASA and the Apollo Space Program. Our former instrument was made of transistors, this instrument is completely digital and uses computer chips to store information. All the pipe sounds are sampled from real pipes. And the organ plays back those digitally recorded sounds. The instrument is completely made in the USA, in Macungie PA to be exact. The console is made of solid hardwood. The organ is 10 years old and comes from a church in Rochester that closed. Along with the new console we also purchased 4 speakers to replace the old ones. The new speakers will be mounted in the existing speaker house above the choir loft. Our thanks to everyone who donated to this project. While it isn't a pipe organ it's a beautiful instrument that will serve St. Luke for many years to come.



Two Cups of Coffee in Exchange for a New Pastor!

Did you wonder what the pink envelopes were for? Each month you receive in your offering envelopes one that is pink. At the annual congregational meeting it was discussed that not everyone was clear on what the pink envelopes were to be used for. Some people were not getting their envelopes at all or they didn't have a pink one in it. Some didn't understand what the pink ones were for. The pink envelopes are to help pay the mortgage. They were formerly designated to our building campaign. When that campaign ended it was asked that these be used for a donation above and beyond your giving to the regular (white) offering envelopes. This money would be used to pay the mortgage.

Right now we are not bringing in enough to cover the mortgage with these pink envelopes. That means each month we must take money from the general budget to cover the mortgage. As it was discussed at the congregational meeting this practice has left us short. When Pastor Wicher left, the mortgage payments started. So while we have been comfortably paying our bills at present, we are about \$50,000.00 short annually for the salary of a new pastor. The call committee decided not to call a new Pastor last month for this reason. If we have approximately 200 giving families or individuals and each gave about \$6.00 more per week, we could make our budget and be able to afford a new Pastor.

How much do you want a new Pastor? Can you afford to give \$6.00 more per week? Someone at the meeting mentioned that \$6 is about two cups of coffee at Tim Horton's. It's less than a pizza, or a lunch out on a work day. Could you give up those two cups of coffee per week, or make some other small sacrifice for a new Pastor?

We ALL need to take responsibility and solve the financial problems at OUR church. Our children will thank us some day for doing this. If you are not getting your envelopes or the pink ones are not in your package please call the church office and talk to Debbie. Let us all do what we can, to help the church we love, to get a new Pastor and grow, and serve others in our small portion of God's Kingdom here on earth.

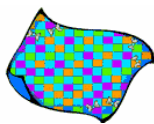

5. New Provisions The Bible says not to worry about tomorrow for tomorrow has enough worries of its

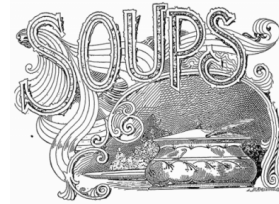
own. Trust in your Heavenly Father who knows everything you need, who is your God and your Provider. He is faithful and He will do it (Matt. 6:25-34).
