Dear St. Luke Family,

As I write this, I've noticed that there are a lot of icicles around. Some are here at church, others in the homes of people around the neighborhood. Perhaps you have one at your house. Simply put, icicles form when snow melts off a warm insulated roof and then runs down and encounters freezing air in overhand or gutters. They start out small yet over time, with each drop of water, they build up.

Now that they look beautiful to look at, they can cause problems. Icicles, and the ice that produces them, clog gutters. This can lead to ice dams and allow water into your home. If they fall, they can break windows and dent cars. If a person gets hit one causes cuts, bruises, broken bones, or worse yet, a falling icicle can kill someone.

And yet, the same thing can



happen with anger. Like an icicle, we can sometimes allow anger to build up, and over time it grows larger and larger, and it can cause problems, anger damages friendships, ruins marriages, and even causes people to have physical problems.
